GLITTER PENCIL CASE

Store your pencils in style this school year with this DIY Glitter Chevron Pencil Case. It's the perfect amount of sparkle without getting totally carried away.



Materials:

Pencil case
Chevron Shape Tape from FrogTape
Tulip Fashion Glitter Bond
Foam brush
Tulip Fashion Glitter



- Place a piece of the chevron tape across the front of the pencil case. The higher up you place it, the more glittery your pencil case will be.
- Using the foam brush, coat the section below the tape line with an even coat of fabric glue.
- Pour the glitter over the wet glue. Press it down with your fingers to ensure that it sticks.
- Make sure to save the excess glitter by returning it to the container.
- Let the glue dry and remove the tape to reveal your awesome new pencil case!

LACE BACKPACK

Just because last year's backpack isn't in tip top shape doesn't mean you need to purchase a new one. With a little creativity and a few basic supplies, you can make it look brand new!



Materials:

Old backpack Lace Sprayable fabric glue Newspaper



- Clean your old backpack by placing it in the washing machine or washing it by hand in the sink.
- Decide where you want to add the lace.
 Once you have picked where you want the lace to go, trim it down to the right size.
- Placing the lace upside down on top of the newspaper, spray with the sprayable fabric glue. Spray from about 8 inches above the lace.
- Pick up the lace and place it down where you had planned for it to go. Press down firmly.
- Let the glue dry overnight and in the morning you will have an awesome new lace backpack!

MAGNETIC PAPER CLIP HOLDER

Paperclips can be a pain in the butt if you don't have a way to properly store them. So why not DIY yourself a nifty Magnetic Paperclip Holder? Brilliant storage solutions have never looked this cool.



Materials:

3 Paperweights
Magnetic paint
Acrylic paint (color of your choice)
Paint brush
E6000 glue



- Mix your magnetic paint well, then paint all three paperweights with it.
 Allow plenty of time for paperweights to dry.
- Use a coat or two of your acrylic paint to cover your paperweights. Set them aside to dry.
- Glue your paperweights on top of one another. You can place your paperweight asymmetrically for added visual interest.
- Slap your paper clips all over the paperweights, where they will stay in place until you need to use them.

PVC PIPE DESK ORGANIZER

A cluttered desk is a sure way to slow down production. What if you could store your school supplies without taking up space on your desk? Now you can! With this DIY PVC Pipe Organizer, you will be able to store all of your supplies on the wall in an awesome display.



Materials:

4 2.5" PVC coupling 3 1.75" PVC coupling 2 1.5" PVC coupling E6000 glue Spray paint



- Start off by giving all of the PVC couplings 3 coats of spray paint. Make sure to do this outside.
- Once dry, arrange the pieces how they appear in this picture, or be creative and form a different pattern.
- Using the E6000 glue, attach your pieces together. Allow plenty of time for the glue to dry.
- Hang the organizer on the wall and fill it with all of your school supplies.

BEDAZZLED LOCKER MIRROR

Your locker is like your room at school; it's your space to decorate and express yourself! This Bedazzled Locker Mirror will help you do just that.




Materials:

Basic locker mirror
Contact Paper
Scissors
Latex caulk
Flat-back rhinestones
Popsicle stick



- To protect the mirror itself, cut a piece of contact paper to the exact size of the mirror and stick it down.
- Fill the frame part of the mirror with a layer of caulk. It doesn't have to look nice yet.
- Use the popsicle stick to smooth out the calk and to add any kind of swirl effect that you may want.
- Before the caulk dries and starts to harden, randomly place rhinestones and slightly press them down. Make sure not to press the rhinestones down too far that they get covered in caulk.
- Let the mirror dry completely according to the directions on the caulk tube. Once dry, remove the contact paper and hang your creation in your locker!

Materials:

Plastic tray
Chalkboard paint
Paintbrush
Chalk
Letter stickers



- Paint the tray with 3 thin coats of chalkboard paint, allowing paint to dry between each coat.
- Prime the surface by rubbing a piece of chalk all over the tray and wiping it off with a damp paper towel.
- Use the letter stickers to spell out "[Your Name]'s First Day Of"
- Simply write in chalk the grade you are going into and hold your chalk-board sign in all your back to school pictures!



DAYS TIL SUMMER COUNTDOWN

What's the first thing on everyone's mind once school begins again? Summer, of course! With this DIY Days 'Til Summer countdown, you'll always have the end in sight.



Materials:

4x6" wooden frame 4x6" white cardstock Acrylic paint Foam brush Washi tape Marker 1.5x2.5" number print outs Mod podge Binder clip



1

Paint the wooden frame with 2-3 coats of the acrylic paint.

2

Using the marker, write "Days til Summer" near the bottom of the piece of cardstock and then frame the cardstock.

3

Arrange the number print outs in order with the lowest number on the bottom of the stack.

4

Use the binder clip to hold the individual letters together tightly.

5

Bind them together by applying 2 coats of Mod Podge to the top edge of the stack.

6

Take a piece of washi tape and wiggle it between the numbers one and two. Then stick the washi tape to the frame so the numbers are where you want them. Add another piece of washi tape to the bottom of the frame to make it more visually balanced.



Peel off one number with every day that passes and before you know it, it will be summer!



CUSTOMIZED BINDER

No one wants a boring binder! This year, make a binder that reflects who you are and what you love. This customized binder covered in things that make you happy will make you smile in even the most boring classes.



Materials:


Paint brush

Plain chipboard binder Magazines Clip art images Scissors Mod Podge



- Flip through magazines and cut out any images that you see of your favorite things. You can also look for free images on the computer and print them out.
- Cut out and arrange the images on your binder. Fill in empty spaces with smaller images or move the images around to avoid empty spaces.
- After the images are arranged in a way that looks good to you, adhere them down with Mod Podge.
- Go over the collage with a layer of Mod Podge to seal and protect the binder.
- You can either leave it how it is at this point or you can add your name by finding the individual letters that make up your name in the magazine and Mod Podge them on the collage.

STICKY NOTE CALENDAR

No need to go out and buy a calendar! With supplies you already have around the house, you can make your own Sticky Note Calendar! It will help you stay on task and up to date. Plus, it is super easy to change out each month!




Materials:

3 different colors of sticky notes Washi tape Sharpies Mini sticky notes



- As straight as you can, place a 4 foot piece of washi tape on the wall about 3 inches below where you want the top of the calendar to be.
- Under that piece of washi tape, stick 7 sticky notes to the wall, write the days of the week on each one.
- Place another piece of washi tape under the days of the week and add 5 rows of a different color sticky notes to represent the days of the month. Write the dates in the top right corner. Make sure you start numbering them on the correct day of the week.
- Above the first piece of washi tape, place 3 sticky notes of the last color directly next to each other. On these sticky notes, write the month.
- Use the mini sticky notes to add events to your calendar.


Materials:

7 empty soup cans White spray paint Scrapbook paper Hot glue Plastic turntable Ribbon



- Spray paint all of the empty soup cans with 2 coats of white spray paint.
- Using the hot glue, wrap all of the cans in coordinating patterns of scrapbook paper.
- Arrange the tin cans on the plastic turntable.
- To add a finishing touch, hot glue a piece of ribbon all the way around the turntable.
- Fill the cans with school supplies.



Craft knife

Design site/software (picmonkey.com is a great resource)




- Log onto your Instagram account and save your favorite photos to your desktop.
- Using the design software of your choice, design a fun and personal composition book cover from your favorite Instagram photos. Be sure to check the size of your notebook, because they're all different.
- With your foam brush, apply a medium layer of Collage Pauge to your composition notebook.
- Lay your printed work on your composition book and be sure there aren't any air bubbles.
- Take your craft knife around the end of the composition book and cut the excess paper off of the book.
- Apply a top layer of Collage Pauge onto your book.
 - For a finishing touch, cover the edge of your notebook with Duck Tape.





Acting fast before the glue dries, place a silk flower or multiple flowers to cover the metal area or as much of it as possible.


Remove any glue strands from the flowers. Now you can fashionably hang all kinds of notes in your locker!


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
